

Application for Partnership for International Education Grant

Terms and conditions of the Grant:

The Partnership for International Education Grant is designed to recognize, award, and assist international and legal non-resident students who wish to continue their studies on a post-secondary level. The role of the grant is to aid international and legal non-resident students in achieving their desire to obtain a career education on the collegiate level.

Following are the terms and conditions for the grant distribution, and the manner in which the grant will be administered for international and legal non-resident students that wish to attend National College.

1. International and legal non-resident (possessing a valid alien number) students will be awarded this grant. Money received under this grant may be used solely for educational purposes (tuition and fees).
2. Students that meet the criteria for the Partnership for International Education Grant will receive \$300 United States dollars for each consecutive term for a period of one year. The student must be enrolled full-time (12 credit hours). The total amount of the grant is \$1200 for the first academic year. These funds are applied to tuition and fees while the student is enrolled at National College. Upon recommendation by the Director of International Programs or the Campus Director, and upon approval by the Vice President / Regional Director of Operations, students who have had an interruption in their attendance due to returning to their home country for Visa or health-related issues may still be eligible to receive the remainder of their award.
3. National College will provide up to 100 Partnership for International Education Grants each year. The certification of receipt of the Partnership for International Education Grant application will be based upon the date that it is received by National College's Director of International Programs. The award year for the grant is defined as July 1st to June 30th. The total amount of funds allocated by National College for the scholarship is \$100,000 each award year.
4. National College places this grant in force for applications received after October 1, 2003. The availability of the grant will be evaluated at the end of each calendar year.

If you are making application for an F-1 student Visa, submit the following materials to National College:

- Completed National College International Student application and \$125 application fee;
- The grant form signed and dated by the student and the student's sponsor; and
- A letter of sponsorship

If you are making application as a legal non-resident student, submit the following materials to National College:

- Completed National College application for admission and \$30 application fee; and
- A copy of the student's green card and alien number.

Duties of all parties to the Grant:

It is required that all parties sign and date this agreement and grant application. The signature of the student and sponsor are required to complete the applications process for the Partnership for International Education Grant.
